This product aims to assist Namibia service providers with knowledge of the various mental health and psychosocial support services around Namibia.

While product came out of a *rapid* mapping exercise at the local, regional and national levels, limitations do exist. Most notably, those listed here have not been thoroughly evaluated for functioning and quality, nor are they capable and ready to offer specialized services catering to the vast emergent needs of COVID-19. Those who provided and compiled the information are not liable for outcomes from engagement. Section 2 highlights the various limitations in detail and offers some recommendations for consideration. Nevertheless, this compilation of service providers offer a solid baseline of existing available support services that can assist to improve linkages and effective collaborations between organizations, ministries and agencies (OMAs) to effectively identify and early intervene around provision of collective stronger social welfare work force in Namibia during times of COVID-19.

It coincides with a master list in an excel spreadsheet form that can further developed and updated.

FOREWORD

COVID-19 has brought new challenges front and center to Namibia. The various emergent and highly complex medical issues often trigger new or compound existing mental health and psychosocial issues. The challenges are diverse, vast and intense for those infected or affected by the virus, such as mandated isolation, worsening depression, anxiety, stigma and discrimination. They also directly contribute to increased rates of risk of violence, abuse and suicide. Namibia is further challenged by efforts working in isolation from one another, resulting in those at greatest risk and need not able to

access the existing support services they need for a multitude of reasons: proximity to, awareness of, trust issues with, competing priorities of both individuals in need and service providers, normalization of risk circumstances and lack of effective linkage to and engagement with services.

At the same time, these new COVID-19 realities serve as excellent opportunities to bring the existing gaps to the surface, while requiring service providers and support systems to explore how to effectively serve those at risk of and/or affected by COVID-19. This applies to all cadres of line ministries, organisations and agencies working who can be instrumental in the strengthening the collective support services. Also to play an instrumental role are the community level supports (e.g. churches and community level lay counselors) that exist and can support the other formalized existing structures and services.

Namibia's vision 2030 and its laws and policies (such as the Child Care and Protection Act, No.3 of 2015, the National Agenda for Children, Namibia's Harambee Prosperity Plan and National Development Plan of Namibia) provide solid road maps to serve the wellbeing of Namibians. However, the actual implementation of them still remains short. To achieve it, it requires meaningful and highly strategic support and service provision across existing sectors, including community leaders, government ministries and civil society. There is no time more important than now with what we are facing with COVID-19 to pull together to put these visions and plans into practice.

While the challenges will remain significant in the days to come, this directory is aimed to be the first of many steps needed to identify and map any existing services who can assist with this harmonization and service delivery enhancement with ensuring Namibians are able to access and effectively engage with getting their mental health and psychosocial needs addressed in Namibia. It is well recognized that while even those listed here may not adequately be able to meet the varied and respective needs, they can, however, play an equally vital role around identification, supportive linkage and follow up those in need.

Let us unite as a nation during COVID-19 and lay the foundation for Namibia to exemplify how we can serve and have an equitable, inclusive and just Namibia to promote health, prosperity and wellness for all of Namibians.

1. Background

Namibia has the second highest income disparity in the world with 26.9% of its people living under poverty and 15.8% under severe poverty, unable to meet their basic living needs. The poorest of the poor face the greatest inequalities, social exclusion and vulnerabilities, with less access to quality water, sanitation and health/support services. They are often having multiple compounding factors contributing to their not accessing available services. As there is a strong psychosocial nexus between risk and vulnerabilities, many face violence, exploitation and abuse at higher rates and need protection measures. If unsupported and unaddressed, physical, social and psychological outcomes remain poor. Therefore, prevention and early intervention (PEI) services are essential, and highlighted in the Child Care and Protection Act, 3 of 2015 (CCPA) in order to:

Restore, strengthen and mobilizing supports and systems to promote wellbeing by:

- Mitigating risks and preventing harm.
- Strengthening resilience to recover from adversity.
- Improving care conditions to promote and enable individuals to survive and thrive.

These above aspects need to be addressed at all levels of care: individual, dyad, peer group, family and community. Most importantly in order to do so, there need to be strong and robust systems of care. One reality is that the vast need is Namibia beyond the capabilities of existing system. The social work capacity is not adequate, primarily due to an approximate ratio of 1 social worker 11,000 Namibians. Their capacity is further stretched due to social workers having competing priorities, high caseload, high turnover rates and vacant positions. As Namibia's Fifth National Development Plan calls for collaborative approaches across all offices, ministries, agencies, civil societies, academia, private sector and media, the Child Care and Protection Act mandates the need for integrated approaches, sharing of resources and harmonized service provision to ensure inclusive, integrated efforts to maximize efforts while addressing the disparity gaps. However, in reality systems in Namibia are often not aware of and/or continue to work in isolation from one another. Furthermore, while many existing services and address those living with vulnerabilities, many are not reaching those living in circumstances with the *greatest* risk factors and vulnerabilities. The CCPA's *equity approach* continue to change the dialogue to ensure that existing services are going the extra needed mile to ensure inclusion and effective engagement of those most isolated from services, as with mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) services, which are critical to prevent and early intervene to mitigate the stressors and negative impacts of exposure to risks and vulnerabilities.

During times of crises and emergencies, risk factors and vulnerabilities escalate, often further alienating those in greatest needs from services. They more so require protection and a robust response to stressors and situations to support/improve people's mental health and psychosocial wellbeing.

1.1 ONSET OF GLOBAL CORONA VIRUS (COVID-19) OUTBREAK

With the onset of Corona (COVID-19) virus in March 2020, Namibia entered unchartered territories in a number of ways. While the risks and vulnerabilities were increased, resulting in worsening mental health and psychosocial issues, including depression, anxiety, violence, abuse, exploitation and suicide. The access to services simultaneously became increasing challenged due to decreased mobility realities. The systems were and continued to be tested with gaps are coming to the service. These include:

- COVID-19 increases risk factors around staying at home dynamics, financial stressors (access to food, water and income). Taking the equality approach, the Government provided emergency living subsidies for anyone who lost income and access to emergency food packages for those identified in need. However, in many cases these safety nets did not reach many of those, needing them the most, due to poor awareness about qualifications, lack of documents and/or not having reliable phones. With increased stressors, especially for those living in overcrowded and high-risk homes, the risk of exploitation and abuse increases. Moreover those living with greatest vulnerabilities often have complex and compounding issues and needs.
- COVID-19 has brought on additional accessibility to services challenges, including mobility and implementation restrictions, worsening the ability of those at highest risk to *not* connect to the available services. The access to key safety nets, such as schools, churches and other services were likewise cut off, as they were directed to close and remain home ceasing activities in order to in order to avoid gatherings and spread of the virus.
- Many cases are not reported to services. In many communities, there is poor understanding about the avenues of reporting. Some express the felt realities that even with reporting, the ability of follow up is insufficient. In most cases, the vast unmet community need is beyond the ability of social welfare systems with many not accessing the support systems they need. Additional barriers are:
 - Those living in remote areas lacking access to existing services to there being a psychological 'push and pull' with wanting and getting the services they need.
 - o Many living in a sexual exploitative environment may have legitimate fear and safety concerns. Poorly planned interventions may put them at greater risk of exploitation, abuse, including death.
- In regard to stakeholders, the stay at home orders complicated work circumstances. Many struggled to balance their personal and work life, having limited access to internet and needing to do homeschooling for their children. Many were deemed non-essential workers, and as times were unprecedented, initially directives were lacking, making it more complicated to work effectively. Much of the programming came to a standstill, contributing to massive stressors on systems to meet their targets, especially around supporting those living with the greatest vulnerabilities.

- With the establishment of COVID-19 task forces, including psychosocial support task force, many responders are not aware of existing support systems. At the same time, existing services have different levels of knowledge, skill sets, functionality and capacity.
- The organizations, ministries and agencies (OMAs) still working in isolation from another, hindering collective efforts, resulting in duplication of and/or vast gaps in service delivery. This also contributes to increased stress for first responders calling for harmonized systems and resource sharing across OMAs to ensure reaching beyond their borders, including others at greatest risks and vulnerabilities.
- COVID-19 emerged as a crisis and stakeholders were not trained on how to respond.
- With COVID-19 the increase of domestic violence and abuse, places of safety still remain a challenge as some regions do not have places of safety and others face lack of financial and/ or human resources.

1.2 DEVELOPMENT OF A DIRECTORY OF MHPSS

Working in isolation hinders efforts, while strengthening the coordination and collaboration allows for complementary approaches. As a part of collective system enhancement a *rapid mapping* was done to identify and assess available MHPSS services provided by organisations, professional, paraprofessionals and lay counselors throughout Namibia.

The aim of this rapid mapping exercise is to strengthen prevention and response services in Namibia during COVID-19 to effectively meet vast compounding needs and demands. The creation of a directory of supportive mental health and psychosocial services (MHPSS) will assist service providers to create stronger collective, networking social welfare workforce throughout Namibia. The workforce aims to include any existing available:

- Professionals (such as licensed private and public social workers and psychologists)
- Paraprofessionals (such as community health workers and service providers); and
- Lay counsellors services (such as trained community volunteers)

Additional gateway players and other emergency support and protection services are equally vital. These include:

- Service providers who may encounter individuals in need of MHPSS support (e.g. leads for food bank and/or meal provisions);
- Police and gender based violence protection units
- Shelters and places of safety
- Support groups

- Treatment and rehabilitation services
- Networking bodies, such as forums and task forces able to assist with fast tracking direct linkage and collaborations

This mapping is the first step in laying a foundation for enhanced strategic planning and harmonized efforts and service provision. Moreover, they can assist with expedited awareness raising and messaging, increased identification and early interventions along with promoting effective engagements through supportive linkage, engagement and follow up.

The rapid mapping methodology was multifold:

- To work at the national level of Ministry of Health and Social Services (MHSS) to identify any existing and active registered welfare organizations;
- To collate information on any existing registered professional or paraprofessional registered with the Health Professions Councils of Namibia (HPCNA);
- To work at national/head office leads of offices, ministries and agencies (OMAs) to identify their service provision and contacts throughout Namibia;
- To work at the local / regional levels to gather information about what OMAs exist on the ground. This also includes identification of any existing trained lay/peer counselors who may not be formally registered or tracked and may be underutilized and/or assist with system strengthening.

Two primary outcomes of there efforts are:

- 1. Creation of *a master excel spreadsheet* of all/any service delivery programmes and contacts, which can be shared and updated over time;
- 2. This *draft national/regional service directory* to be shared and used by both community and service providers.

Both aimed to include the following information: any existing individual counselors/counseling services, their gender, affiliated organizations, per constituency/region as detailed as possible, mandate and assessment of their level of expertise and availability.

2. LIMITATIONS AND CHALLENGES OF MHPSS RAPID MAPPING

Despite significant efforts done throughout the rapid mapping exercise, many challenges were experienced and/or noted in systems:

- The list on welfare organizations provided by MHSS was out-dated, as any registered organizations are not deregistered. While the information may exist in the formal files, the provided information did not include service areas, mandates or targets. The given contact information was often out-dated due to leadership turnover.
- The Health Professions Councils of Namibia's response was also limited. They noted that they were not allowed to provide any contact or service provision information due to confidentiality. The provision of practitioner's name and licensing alone would not provide much insight.
- Neither MHSS nor the Health Professions Council track paraprofessionals nor lay counsellors, thus gathering their information was dependent on direct OMA direct contact at the national, regional and local levels.
- Working off any previous lists also had its challenges, as information was often extremely limited and out-dated due to high turnover rates, changing contact information and/or fragility of systems.
- Service providers often work in isolation from one another limiting capacities for comprehensive mapping and case management. This coincided with there being poor overall awareness/knowledge of available local service providers, especially lay counsellors, as many previous programmes collapsed and are no longer functional.
- Some stakeholders reflected that existing services do not go 'deep' and reach those living with the greatest vulnerabilities. Rather efforts are often more 'check box approaches,' working with those who present to and are motivated to receive services. However, the reality is that often those living with the greatest vulnerabilities and need the services, often do not access nor effectively connect to them due to varying and often highly complex and compounding issues.
- Along this line, standard referrals are often not enough. Many psychosocial barriers exist to
 assist with effective linkage and engagement and require a level of assessment to ensure that
 the client(s) have the understanding and ability to link to and engage with service providers.
 It is often the case, that supportive, creative measures are needed to ensure effective linkage.

- The quality, skillset and functionality of the various services is not standardized nor clear. While some community lay counsellors may have had formal extensive training, some others may have received minimal. At the same time, one can have highly skilled community counsellors in a low functioning organization, while having counsellors with low skill sets limiting their ability even in a well-functioning organization. Both scenarios present challenges around effective engagement. It should therefore be noted, that *while their contact information and services exist in this directory, the skill set and support capabilities are varying, may be limited and not known.*
- MGEPESW is supposed to have emergency shelters within each region. However, they are not yet fully operational. While most regions have designated spaces and furniture for them, they do not have designated staff to administer and manage them.
- The lack of resources such as airtime for lay counsellors to work effectively and report cases.

3. RECOMMENDATIONS

- Additional follow up mapping to thoroughly assess for quality, functionality, targets and capacities to inform strategic networking possibilities to broaden reach to effectively reach most marginalized from service providers.
- Exploration and use of academic institutions. This connection can be three fold:
 - 1. **Identification and recruitment of recent graduates:** MHSS together with University of Namibia (UNAM) identified their recent social work graduates not permanently employed. The expansion of this to seek out graduates of recent years and/or other disciplines (e.g. psychology) can be explored.
 - 2. **Use of current university students in professional disciplines:** While students in the field of MHPSS have limited scope of practice and require close supervision, they often can be very instrumental in expansion of quality resources. This can be done as part of their practical experience with small-scale community projects and/or internships and can be very instrumental in gathering research level data. For example, since the start of COVID-19, UNAM's social work students have been doing some outreach programming to the two refugee centers serving the homeless populations in Windhoek. This also can be built upon within University of Namibia's Social Work and Psychology Programmes. Not only can this model assist with resource/information strengthening, it also sharpens the practical skill sets for the soon to be graduates.
 - 3. **Use of other paraprofessional academic programming**: University of Namibia's and IUM's HIV Care and Management Programmes, both requiring a number of basic courses in counselling. As the programmes have varying components / information around psychosocial challenges, barriers to care and effective HIV counselling for individuals and those affected, the skill set can easily be nurtured to cater to COVID-19 realities. As lay counsellors are not registered in Namibia, reaching out to these institutions to gather the list of their graduates should be explored. However, to maximize outcomes, lay/community and paraprofessional level counsellors will require sensitization, capacity building and supervision.
- Creating a formal registry of paraprofessionals with associated standards will assist with
 maximizing their use and offering opportunities to include them in broader programming.
 With some programming collapsing, there may be existing and capable trained lay individuals,
 who may be at home and underutilized.
- Along with increased awareness, smooth and supportive referral pathways between MHPSS service providers need to be created/strengthened to assist with effective linkages, especially for those most marginalized from services. This requires creating supportive and meaningful connections with social workers and the various existing paraprofessionals and community lay counsellors to effectively identify and fill the existing gaps to strengthen collective MHPSS services in Namibia.

- Capacity building needs to be considered when scouting for and inclusion of pre-existing counselors and services working within the communities. This also includes the faith based organizations and churches. All need to be sensitized into aspects around COVID and the recent laws (e.g. Child Care and Protection Act and Trafficking in Persons) and their associated approaches (client-centered care), referral pathways and aspects of COVID-19 to maximize their efforts and collective impacts.
- Incorporate untapped leadership structures within communities to assist further with community and system MHPSS strengthening (e.g. community leaders and junior counsellors). Moreover, there is a need for inclusion and representation of different populations when scouting for pre-existing community members with skill sets (e.g. people living with disabilities or HIV).
- Feasible and sustainable plans need to be devised by MGEPESW to manage the emergency shelters in each region: either government led and/or with collaborating OMA partners. Creative measures should be explored to ensure low cost/trusted management (e.g. managed by a local support group with lobbied support via cost sharing, business community, or income generating projects).
- Further it should be noted, that during emergency times, first responders need psychosocial support. This aspect is two-fold:
 - 1. MHPSS services will be needed for those in the field, who are working exhausting hours and overwhelmed with the encountered cases and may experience secondary trauma;
 - 2. Those offering MHPSS also need to have ample opportunities for debriefing and self-care.

4. NATIONAL AND MULTI-REGIONAL MHPSS CONTACTS

Emergencies require expedited linkage to support. In many instances, the *first available point of contact* may not be the person who can adequately meet their respective needs. Nevertheless – their accessibility and interim support can provide the vital and often lifesaving roles, while they assist with the necessary supportive referrals. This section is divided into three parts: 1) frontline government responders with their national contacts and most relevant service descriptions; 2) emergent and supportive telephone hotlines available; and 3) emergency shelter support and 4) An A to Z list of national and multi-regional MHPSS providers.

4.1 FRONTLINE GOVERNMENT RESPONDERS

In most cases, front line emergency services are governmental institutions: Gender-Based Violence Protection Units (GBVPU), Police Stations, Hospitals/Clinics, and MHSS or MGEPESW Social Worker Offices. Ministry of Sports, Youth and National Service (MSYNS) and Ministry of Education, Arts and Culture (MOEAC) also serve as front line services that can serve as vital points of emergency contacts and can offer interim support while working to engage with more additional services as needed.

It is also vital to register deaths with getting a death certificate. The Namibian Police (NamPol) via the Gender Based Violence Protection Units (GBVPUs) protects adults and children from all forms of violence, abuse and neglect. They handle such cases with counselling, medical examination, criminal investigation and legal advice. They also handle child offender cases, keeping them separate from adult prisoners and engage their families as needed.	

4.2 NATIONAL TELEPHONE SUPPORT FOR IMMEDIATE/EMERGENCY SUPPORT

However, as many may not be ready or able to go in person, telephone hotlines are essential first responders, where they can offer free and available confidential support services, while they explore level of safety and appropriate referrals as needed. They are available to anyone regardless of location. The below list represents these free and available hotlines/call centers to get access to immediate / emergency support.

4.3 EMERGENCY SHELTER SUPPORT

The Ministry of Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication and Social Welfare (MGEPESW) are still in the process of establishing emergency shelters. They are not formally operational due to renovation needs and/or lack of staff to manage them. However, on a case-by-case basis, special circumstances make still make them available through the regional MGEPESW social workers. Many in emergency shelters will be assessed and transferred to longer term residential facilities (*listed in section 6*).


